

## Call for Proposals: EU Researcher's Night The Future of Al-Human Relationships - A Dialogue with the Unite! Alliance Researchers

Dear Unite! Artificial Intelligence researchers at TU Darmstadt,

We are looking for Unite! researchers to present their research on AI and engage young people in the online event **EU Researcher's Night** on 29 September. The event is part of UNITE.H2020, the project developing the research and innovation (R&I) dimension of the Unite! Alliance.

The EU Researcher's Night is an event to communicate and promote research that takes place in all EU Member States and Horizon Europe Associated Countries. The aim of the event is to promote excellent research projects, raise public awareness of the importance and benefits of R&I, highlight its tangible impact on the daily lives of citizens and stimulate young people's interest in science and research careers.

This years' EU Researcher's Night, called **The Future of Al-Human Relationships - A Dialogue with the Unite! Alliance Researchers**, will take place online on <u>29 September from 10:00 CET to 12:00</u> <u>CET.</u> The audience will be a group of <u>high school students (15-17 years old)</u> invited by the Unite! partners.

The objectives of the online event are:

- to briefly present the European University model that Unite! is working on and its offer for prospective students (presented by the Secretary General of Unite!),
- to show that being a researcher is interesting, exciting, amazing and gives you the opportunity to work with colleagues from all over the world and shape the future, and
- to explain some elements and reflections on the history, present and future of Al-Human Relationships (e.g. learning with Al challenges).

If you are interested, we ask that you submit a proposal including the topic and contents of your presentation along with a brief CV (3-4 sentences) by 11 August 2023.

We would like to have an interactive session, like a panel discussion, where students ask questions to the researchers. To this end, we suggest that you provide, in addition to the presentation you will hold in September, a short summary of the topics by the end of August. The summary will be sent to the students to help them conceptualise their questions in advance.

Please keep in mind that this experience can serve as a dissemination and communication activity for your funded research projects.
