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This workshop is geared to the needs of post-doctoral researchers who have already gained some experience in scientific writing through their doctoral dissertation and are now facing new professional challenges.

On top of getting your own papers published in journals with a high impact factor, you may find yourself being involved as a peer reviewer; you will also be dealing with timing paper and book chapter submissions, appropriate and successful oral and written communication with journal and book editors, and a realistic, sustainable approach to handling your workload effectively.

#### Contents in brief:

- writing peer reviews: expectations, standards, and strategies
- writing successful conference and paper abstracts
- organising the publishing process, and communicating with editors
- time, task and self management: planning realistic writing projects
- expressing yourself professionally in your discipline: vocabulary development

Additional topics may be discussed according to the needs and questions brought in by the participants.

The workshop is held in English. The small group size allows participants to ask questions and receive helpful feedback both from the trainer and the rest of the group.
